The Hospice Society has a thorough screening process for all volunteers including a Criminal and Child Abuse Registry check, personal interview and over 30 hours of standardized training.

- Hospital visiting with the Palliative Care Program
- Holiday deliveries to clients and families
- Community awareness and grief support events such as Angels Remembered, HUGS, and Services of Remembrance
- Fund raising events such as, Hike for Hospice, our weekly 50/50 draw The Bucket List, and our Sharing the Knowledge Conference
- The Hospice Memorial Garden maintenance
- Serving on our Board of Directors and/or organizational committees
